FILM.

Host a film screening. SHI offers several documentaries or check out other films on the topic. Opening it up to lecture & discussion afterward provides an opportunity to inform!

DESIGN.

Conduct a design your own t-shirt/photo contest. This is a great way to highlight the issue while showcasing students' talents.

MUSIC.

Plan a benefit concert. Ask well-known artists or local favorites to donate their talent or sponsor your campus's coffeehouse events and design your own coffee-slip with facts about sex trafficking.

FASHION.

Host your own fashion show. Use brands that are relevant, companies that want to participate, and even create your own line to speak to the masses.

[Net.]working

START A MOVEMENT.

Inspire your college campus to get involved. Create a club on campus to gather a support group.

SOCIALIZE.

Cater to your social networks. Add friends on Facebook, recruit fans for SHI, post SHI videos on YouTube, sign up for Google alerts on human trafficking, blog about the issue, etc.

BE A RESOURCE.

Use what you have learned to introduce the issue to willing professors of social justice, volunteerism, sociology, and politics. Make a presentation to their students or forward fact sheets to them.

GET TO KNOW.

Be in touch with your local Human Trafficking Task Force to find out what you can do to help. Get involved within your community!

[Step Up.]

AUCTION.

Host an auction that focuses on handicrafts made by survivors of the modern day slave trade. Proceeds go to support the eradication of sex slavery.

MARCH. VIGIL.

To honor the victims of sex trafficking, a symbolic candle-lit vigil can be held in sync with a powerful march. Lead a unified voice on campus.

MENTOR.

Help educate at-risk youth about the dangers of sex trafficking to prevent and limit the vulnerability of America's children.

COMPETE.

Sign-up for relays or other team events in Shared Hope International's name!

CONNECT WITH CONGRESS.

Write a letter to your state senator & congressman, addressing the concerns of domestic minor sex trafficking within your community. The barriers and discrepancies between the federal and state laws have created alarming concern.

PRAY.

If you are part of a campus ministry or a member of the faith community, create prayer cards for the victims of sex trafficking.

CHANNEL.

Be a resource to your school's newspaper, radio station, broadcast news, and any other media outlet.

AFFILIATE.

Join SHI's fight, purchase an End Demand shirt or button to give to a friend or sign-up to be a Defender.
